FROM THE CHAIR

It is my pleasure to present the Bi-Annual Report of years 2016 and 2017. In our previous annual reports we have been continuously emphasising on India's Rural Development. I have strong feeling that the growth of India is 100% possible and achievable with Rural Development. Besides formal education in schools and colleges we need to educate not only children but also citizens about various subjects like water conservation, rain water harvesting, digital financial transaction and environment protection etc. The formal education gives us jobs security to some extent but security of society in terms of better environment, safe drinking water and sanitation facilities to all citizens can be imparted by the elected Governments at centre and state level. Besides elected governments social organizations like voluntary organization and NGOs can play vital role by organizing small workshops and seminars on subjects like Rain Water Harvesting and digital financial transactions. Our education is incomplete if one gets formal education and he /she does not have understanding of subjects like water, sanitation, environment, respect to senior citizens and fellow citizens.

In my opinion every citizen must concentrate on learning basic understanding of conservation of water and environment. HWFG has been making sincere efforts in this direction and trying to create such habits in school going children.

Even after 69 years of Independence rural India's development is far behind than the developed countries in the world. Present and previous Union Government of India has been continuously laying emphasis on Rural Development of India.

I have no doubt that unless every citizen of India contributes in this mission of Rural Development of GOI, the development of rural India would not be possible. We should not leave everything to Government. We must come forward and start classes at village level or at community level. In this regard, Human Welfare Foundation Gurgaon has been making sincere efforts with the help of retired senior citizens, technocrats, doctors and educationists in its mission of Rural Development through education.

Water is essential for the environment, food security and sustainable development. Millions still do not have sustainable access to safe drinking water in Asia and Africa. The increasing urbanization is a normal process of economic development/growth and the challenge is to make sustainable, efficient and equitable. Now the central government and state governments of various states in India have been taking financial assistance from Asian Development bank and the World Bank for bringing new projects related to water and waste water. The Union Government of India has taken up Namami Ganga Project for making river Ganga clean like Thames river of London. All these steps are essential and citizen of our country must also understand how sincerely our governments have been working? The success of such schemes launched by various governments also depends on mainly successful participation of its citizens at all levels i.e. village level, block level and district level. I am sure without continuous support and participation of general public no scheme would be 100% successful.

Human Welfare Foundation has been conducting classes /workshops for children covering subjects ranging from conservation of water and digital education in the modern time. Here at our Basic Education centre of HWFG we also impart guidance to engineering graduates of rural background about water and waste water sector and I would say that we have come out successfully in this regard. HWFG has associated various retired government employees in its mission of Rural Development and would like to stress that citizens of India must come forward and take such small initiatives and contribute towards the betterment of society to which we owe a lot.

The citizens must come forward with small but good initiatives in the coming years ahead without fail if we want to serve our nation and society at large. I request every educated citizen to devote minimum 2 hours per week for educating underprivileged children of our Rural India, who do not have access to education despite the "Right to Education." Engineers have bigger role to play besides working in private sector as well as in government sectors.

Idea behind establishment of Library:

Everyone would have visited library during school and college days. Earlier we used to go to public libraries. Now adays we do not find public libraries in cities and there is competition amongst urban children to purchase books and access internet and they are not inclined to visit libraries and read books. Hence, we thought that we should create small library for underprivileged children of Rural background who cannot purchase costly books because of less income of their parents but have wish and potential to move ahead in their life. Another idea is to create the concept of donation of books amongst urban children for such libraries which has two objectives: one is to minimise waste of books which parents/children would give to Kabari(Scrap Dealer) at throw away prices. Secondly, if these books are donated then the underprivileged children of Rural India can have access to all these books without spending any money. It would develop a practice of donation amongst our children and they would have an inclination to serve our society. At later on, in my opinion, these children would be generous and responsible citizens of the country which is the ultimate aim and objective of our foundation.

Brief Summary of Programmes and activities by General Secretary R C Gupta

During the year 2016, three executive meetings and one meeting of Advisory Board of the foundation was held from time to time at its office, I-22 (GF), South City-2, Gurgaon. Many important decisions to move ahead in its objectives as enshrined in its basic charter which was drafted at the time of its inception were taken.

At present the foundation has one library for children of BEC and for Senior Citizens at M-388 (GF), Orchid Island, Sector 51, behind Artemis Hospital, Gurgaon (Haryana).

HWFG has been actively imparting moral education to children of Basic Education Centre. Besides it we have been conducting General Studies Test keeping in view the overall development required in present day society of children to compete with urban area children .This test covers the questions of Indian Constitution, Indian History, General Science, Physics, Chemistry and environment. The question paper is first drafted by a committee headed by a seasoned educationist having social service

background with a team of 4 -5 members in his drafting committee. Once the question paper of General studies is drafted then it is reviewed by a Review Committee which is generally headed by retired educationist who has almost spent 40 years in school education and has in depth understanding of conducting such tests for underprivileged children who hail from almost 20 states of our country. The Drafting committee for framing the question paper of General studies is headed by Smt.Umakansal (Educationist and social worker) and the review committee is chaired by Sh.GangaDutt Joshi (Retired Principal from Uttarakhand Board of Education).

Computer Literacy Development Programme for under privileged children of Basic Education Centre of HWFG:

The president of the foundation , Sh.Anil Gupta proposed that we should start developing skills of children of our Basic Education Centre keeping in view the requirement of computer skills in day to day activities as well as requirement of computer skills in getting employment. This idea was discussed with members of executive and advisory board members of Human Welfare Foundation Gurgaon. It was discussed in detail and decided to start “computer literacy project” under the leadership of Mr.Mohit Verma (Computer Science Engineer)and Mr. Vinay Kr. Tewary(Computer Science Engineer).

We have conducted started computer literacy Development Project in November 2016. It has been going on with steady speed. It was also decided to conduct minimum 2 classes per month for children .Presently we have conducting these classes at M-388 GF, Orchid island, Gurgaon(Haryana).

Mobile Library and distribution of old collected books to children of Basic Education Centre.

concept of mobile library cum book shop has been in practice for the last 2-3years . We have gone one step forward in this direction .Executive Body of HWFG decided to collect old books from society to ensure availability of books to children of basic education. A resolution was passed to this effect and advised all members to spread the message in society in order to have more books in our library for distribution among poor kids. Now our foundation members are convincing society members to donate old books and cloths to us to ensure 100% utilisation of books and cloths.

Achievements of Foundation members:

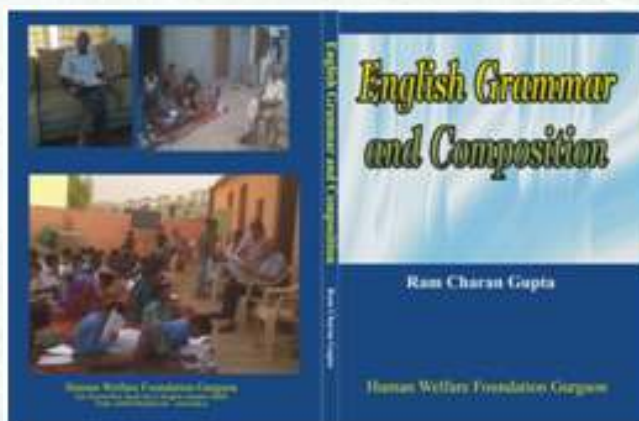
